<p>Grade 3</p>	<p>What does the Trinity do?</p> <p>There is one God in three Persons who are distinct yet work together and share their love. In our liturgy and personal prayer, we worship the Triune God.</p>	<p>Holy Trinity-name for the three Persons in one God Credos-statements of the basic beliefs about God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit, and about other teachings of the Church.</p> <p>Worship-to adore and honor God. Blessed Sacrament-the Holy Eucharist. This term especially refers to the blessed Bread* that is kept in the tabernacle. *Use different term.</p> <p>Prayer-talking and listening to God. It is raising your mind and heart to God. <p>Grade 4</p>	<p>How are we like the Trinity?</p> <p>Loving our neighbor is a way we reflect Trinitarian love. The Trinity helps us hear and follow our conscience.</p>	<p>Dignity-self-worth. Every human is worthy of respect because he/she is made in image of God. Soul-spiritual part of a human that lives forever. Sin-deliberate thought, word, deed, or omission contrary to the law of God. Social sin-sinful social structure or institution that builds up over time so that it affects the whole society.</p> <p>Community-group of people who hold certain beliefs, hopes, and goals in common. (Common good) Morality-living in right relationship with God, yourself, and others; putting your beliefs into action. Parish-Catholic community with shared spiritual beliefs and worship.</p> <p>Free will-God-given ability to choose between good and evil. <p>Grade 5</p>	<p>How do we respond to the Trinity?</p> <p>God offers us many experiences of his presence. The first commandment calls us to right relationship with God through prayer, worship, and the practice of virtue.</p>	<p>Mystery-a truth of faith that you cannot fully understand but that you believe because God has shown it to people in Scripture, in the life of Jesus, or in the teachings of the Church.</p> <p>Holy Trinity-the mystery of one God in three Persons, Father, son and Holy Spirit.</p> <p>Virtue-a habit of doing good that helps you grow in love for God.</p> <p>Image of God-the divine likeness in each person, the result of being created by God.</p> <p>Prayer-talking to and listening to God. Prayer can be private or public; spoken, sung, or silent; formal or spontaneous.</p> <p>Worship-public adoration and honor shown to God in prayer.</p> <p>Liturgy-official public worship of the Church. The word means “the work of the people.”</p> <p>Cardinal Virtues-are acquired by human effort and cooperation with God’s grace.</p>	<p>Baptism of Jesus (Jn 1:32-34)</p> <p>David bring Ark of the covenant to Jerusalem (2 Samuel 6:1-15) Early Church worship (Acts 2:46-47)</p> <p>The Great Commandment (Mk 12:28-34)</p>	<p>Athanasius</p> <p>Cecilia</p> <p>Sir Thomas More</p>
<p>Grade 6</p>	<p>What does God call people to do?</p> <p>The Old Testament recounts God’s saving action in the lives of the Israelites. God the Father sent Jesus to establish a new covenant and show us how to live.</p>	<p>Faith-believing in God and all that God has revealed. Faith is both a gift from God and a free choice.</p> <p>Prayer-raising your mind and heart to God. In prayer, you both listen and talk to God. <i>See grade 4.</i></p> <p>Passover-Jewish holy day that celebrates God’s leading the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt.</p> <p>The Exodus-Israelites’ journey from slavery in Egypt to freedom in promised land, accomplished, directed by God.</p> <p>The Last Supper-Jesus’ celebration of the Passover meal, with the Apostles. During this supper, Jesus turned the bread and wine into his body and Blood.</p> <p>The Decalogue-the Ten Commandments, laws that God gave Moses. The first three commandments have to do with the relationship between God and the people.
